3	I can create a survey to find out information.	This is a Geography lesson. Geography is the study of places and relationships between people and their environments.   Explain to the pupils that today they are going to learn how to create a survey.   Recap the location of Chester (North West England), it's transport links and which river flows through it.   How could we actually find out why people have visited Chester rather than just having a theory (an idea or suggestion)? Ask the children in talk partners to see if they can come up with any ideas. Discuss their suggestions and agree that one way would be to ask people who are in Chester.   In small groups, ask the children to brainstorm what questions they would like to know the answers to.   Agreed questions should include:   • What is the main reason you have visited Chester today?   • How hare you travelled to get here?   • How hare you travelled to Chester?   • How long are you staying in Chester?   • How long are you staying in Chester?   • How have you travelled to chose from. Now repeat the survey but this time ask about favourite pets, giving them a number of options plus 'other'.
