Dear Parents and Carers,

Class Trips and Visitors

- <u>F1</u> Our new Foundation 1 class is up and running and the children are just experiencing their first tasters of life at Mendell. We would really like to welcome all of our new families and children to our Mendell family. We have been learning all about our families and new friends, our new school environment, our rules and routines and having fun with new friends. It has been lovely to see the excitement on the children's faces and hear their laughter as they start on their learning journey. A BIG thank you to all parents and carers who have supported their child during their induction, it has helped all children to settle quickly.
- **F2** F2 have settled into school life and new routines so well. They have enjoyed exploring their new environment and making new friends. We have spent lots of time talking about our families and things that are important to us. In our weekly Forest School sessions, we have explored our forest, made natural mobiles, autumn crowns and had a scavenger hunt. The children have loved reading The Gingerbread Man and completing lots of activities based on the book, including role play and baking their own gingerbread men. The gingerbread man has been leaving us clues about the story, letters and even a video clip which we have been very excited about!
- <u>Y1</u> I am so proud of how Year 1 children have settled in this half term. They have loved getting to know their new environment and Year 1 provision. The children have enjoyed our 'catch up' English sessions with a focus on Black Lives Matter through the story 'Look Up' by Nathan Byron. We looked at a space suit and telescope during our book reveal. Another exciting topic has been our theme of 'Childhood' and we have looked in the past at ourselves and significant events from history.
- <u>Y2</u> Year 2 have made a superb start to the year ahead! In English, the children have really enjoyed reading and exploring the text 'Look Up!' which taught them all about the astronaut Mae Jeminson and her story inspired the children to believe in following their dreams for the future. During our Creative Curriculum topic 'Movers and Shakers' Year 2 have learned about significant people throughout history and particularly William Lever as a local historically significant figure. We participated in a number of Forest Skills sessions in our Forest School area, team building games, exploring nature and using our outdoor environment to support maths and English learning.
- <u>Y3</u> Year 3 have enjoyed a fantastic first half term back at school. The children have really enjoyed looking at different street art as part of our theme 'Urban Pioneers.' A particular highlight was our zoom meeting with the artist Dotmasters. In our Q and A session with Leon. They had a tour of his study and found out interesting facts about scaling, stencilling and finding ideas from everyday experiences. We were extremely lucky to receive an original piece of artwork from Leon, which is currently on display outside of Year 3's classroom. Check out our class twitter page for photos.
- <u>Y4</u> A huge well done to Year 4 who have settled in really well to their new class. Even though there are so many of us in our room they have been so sensible and focussed their learning on our Music topic. The big focus for Year 4 this term is TimesTables Rockstars (TTRS). The children have been working hard to try and play at least 20 minutes each day in school and 20 minutes at home each day. Being able to rapidly recall their multiplication and division facts for the times tables up to x12 is an important skill to prepare them to tackle UKS2 curriculum and beyond and is also a vital building block in their mathematical knowledge. Daily practise of their times tables will also prepare them for the national times tables test that all Year 4 children take in May.
- <u>Y5</u> What a fantastic start to Year 5! The children have enjoyed reading our class text, 'Of Thee I Sing,' wrote a magazine article to celebrate 'Black Heroes' and raise awareness about some of the issues around racial discrimination. Following our theme, 'Alchemy Island,' the children went on a magical journey to find the gold hidden deep within the island's mysterious landscape. The only way was to study the map and unravel the riddle. They children did all they could to learn about gold and master the ancient art of alchemy. The children went on to compose a stunning soundtrack to bring this mysterious landscape to life, which you can see on our Twitter page @mendellyear5. Some of the children also took part in a Bikeability workshop where they learnt key skills on how to stay safe on the road.
- <u>Y6</u> The children have settled in brilliantly and made a fantastic start to Year 6. They have really enjoyed our topic this half term 'A Child's War' and during our impact day, they loved dressing up as an evacuee and making model gas masks. They also worked hard to investigate and make Anderson shelters, which looked authentic. As part of our PSHE, Year 6 had a special virtual workshop to learn about parliament. They found out all about the House of Lords, the House of Commons and the role of MP's.
