		e.g. a person has been appliquéd onto a background			
		fabric, and then on top of that, she has appliquéd the			
		outline of an aeroplane. If you look in the			
		background, all sorts of little pieces of blue cloth			

with writing on them have been appliquéd on as well. So this is a multi-layered piece of appliqué, lots and lots of pieces of fabric joined to the background. Trumpeter by Rachael Howard Created using digital and screen print, appliqué and machine stitch Ben Venom – Jacket designer Uses appliqué as the primary technique for the majority of the quilts and jackets he makes. The foundation of his designs is comprised of donated/recycled fabrics, which are then stitched onto larger pieces of fabric.
