Foundation 2

It has been a pleasure to get to know the F2 children and their families this half term. We have been establishing daily routines and developing attitudes to learning. The children have looked at a timeline of their own lives looking at themselves from the past to the present day. We have explored Autumn changes and used our senses during science sessions. F2 have particularly enjoyed music sessions and singing nursery rhymes. A brilliant start to a wonderful year aged!

Year 1

Year One have thoroughly enjoyed settling in to this year so far and are currently learning about 'Nibbles' and all of his mischievous behaviours. He has nibbled our book covers but we are going to make traps before the end of half term to put an end to this! We have been learning about the history of school and we were lucky enough to have Mrs Wheelan explain how the school has changed over the years. We also discovered a time capsule which has lots of interesting artefacts. In Science, we have been investigating materials and their different properties. Year 2

Year 2 have made a superb start to the year ahead! In English, the children have really enjoyed reading and exploring our nonsense poem 'The Owl and the Pussycat', where we looked at alliteration and rhyming patterns. The children have worked really hard to build their maths fluency this half term. They have also really enjoyed learning about materials in Science and making their own prints in Art and Design.

Year 3

Year 3 have had a fantastic half term! The children have settled into their new classroom brilliantly and have shown determination taking on new challenges and expectations. In Maths we have been learning about Place Value and Addition and Subtraction - we are currently conquering column methods. The children made an outstanding effort in our Times Table Rock Stars Battle of the Bands competition and have enjoyed extra play time for reaching our Dojo Points targets. In English we have been reading 'Seal Surfer'. The children have been writing letters all about the boy's adventures whilst grandad has been away. Miss Holland has brought in her guitar a few times this half term and the children have sung together beautifully. Overall, we have had a great start to Year 3.
